From the Principal

P&C Meeting



This will be our only opportunity to thank two outgoing members who have made major contributions to the P&C and the school over a number of years. Kate Murphy, our President, and Sandy Earle, our Treasurer, are retiring from the P&C as their daughters have completed year 12 this year.

I would like to thank both of them for the work they have done and the support they have given over these years. Each of them has offered their time, ideas and enthusiasm to make Dungog High School a better place. The result of their work can be seen every time students open a textbook, receive medals for mathematics achievement, enjoy the air-conditioning in the new library, use the cattle crush in agriculture, the reality babies or many of the tools in Industrial Arts. They have been the backbone of the P&C since I have been at this school, and they will be sorely missed.

Trade Training Centre: wonderful news

Last week an official announcement from the Commonwealth Government listed the schools that have been successful in gaining funding under the Trade Training Centre proposal. Dungog High School is one of the successful schools. We are in a consortium with other local schools and our submission has gone through the last hurdle. There is still a lot of work to be done – the detail of costings and developing plans, but the hardest part is now over.

What this means to the school is a major upgrade to our TAS facilities – new areas that will allow the teaching of courses that



This will mean that there will still be building happening at the school in 2010, after the current major project is finished, but the gains will be worth the discomfort.

School Certificate Examinations and end of year activities

The SC examinations commence this week. Students have been given detailed information about what to expect at these examinations, and how to put in an appeal if they have a sickness or misadventure that prevents them from attending the examination.

Students have also been informed about attendance requirements after the examination. This information is available on the school website – <u>Google</u> Dungog High School and you will go straight to this site. All newsletters are also available on this site, and a calendar of the term's events.

After the examinations, each faculty will continue to teach their courses, with an emphasis on material that is relevant to students at this point of the year, and in preparation for their Preliminary courses in year 11. There will also be some special programs run, including Peer Support training. The year 10 excursion to Melbourne will be held in this period; students not attending will have special programs provided for them at school.

This information given to year 10 students outlines specific requirements concerning attendance after the SC examinations and permission to attend the Year 10 Graduation Ceremony. If a student gains full time employment after the examinations and still wants to attend the Graduation Ceremony on Monday December 18th, they will need to provide a letter from parents and the employer stating that they are engaged in full time employment. Students who have organized work experience through the school's Careers Adviser will be permitted to attend the graduation. Students whose pattern of attendance after the examinations is very different from that before the exams will not be permitted to attend the Graduation. These students collect their documentation from the school office on or after Tuesday 19th December. All students are required to be in <u>full and correct school uniform</u> if they wish to take part in the Graduation Assembly.

Year 9 Meeting

A reminder that we will be holding a meeting for year 9 parents and students this week to give information on the new laptops that will shortly arrive in the school. The meeting will start at 6.00pm and should be finished by 7.00pm. At present, we are planning on holding it in the new library, but if numbers are high, it will be moved to the MPC. Students will be informed on Wednesday about the venue.
