Peer Support Leader Training 2009

Last Wednesday 42 Year 10 and eight selected Year 9 students travelled to Shoal Bay to undergo training to support the 2010 Year 7 cohort in their transition to our school. This training takes place every year supported by a group of motivated staff and lead by Ms Kerry Smith.

I visited the students in training at Shoal Bay and was very impressed with how the program has developed to include the students as Leaders and Facilitators. This lifts this Peer Support Program to a whole new level extending the students' leaderships skills.

Leaders are taken through sessions that are aimed at developing leadership, communication and group management skills, in an environment that promotes students "being the best" people they can be.

The underlying principles of this training, that has evolved over recent years and is unique to Dungog High School, are self awareness and enhancing relationships across all aspects of students' lives. This allows students to give the Peer Support programme in Term one a higher level of integrity because they actually believe in the programme, having explored it through the training program themselves.



This year, for the first time, the training was facilitated by students who took part in the programme last year when they were in Year 9. These students rose to the challenge and exceeded all expectations.

Having lived through Peer Support this year, they were able to provide valuable insights to their fellow students that deepened their understanding of the program. These insights could not be given to such depth when teachers presented the training in previous years.
