Canteen concerns

I have asked Mrs Edwards to remove some items from the canteen because of problems they were causing for staff. The Sunnyboy iceblocks and one of the icy-poles will no longer be sold after current stocks are finished. The Sunnyboys were being taken into class after lunch, against the classroom rules – these are solid ice-blocks and take a while to finish. Students were buying them late in lunchtime, not finishing them and arguing with teachers to be allowed to bring them into class. The blue ice-blocks have caused a significant litter problem in the school, with the plastic wrapper being put everywhere except the nearest bin.

We have also experienced students being rude to volunteer canteen workers about these items – I put a much higher value on the canteen volunteers than on any item sold there. My decision to remove these items from the list does not mean students have no ice-blocks to purchase – just not the ones that have caused problems.

2013 HSC RULES AND PROCEDURES

This booklet has been issued to all students in Year 11. Every aspect of the HSC is explained in this booklet including information about assessments, completing courses, examination details and HSC results.

This information is also available online on the Board of Studies website.

PRELIMINARY CERTIFICATES

Last week, Year 11 students were presented with their Preliminary Certificates from the Board of Studies which records their progress to date.

Students who are studying VET subjects, also received a Statement of Attainment which listed the competencies they have achieved.

How to Request RoSA credentials

RoSA (Record of School Achievement) credentials will only be sent to eligible Year 10 school leavers at the end of this year. To be eligible a student must have:

- attended a government school, an accredited nongovernment school or a recognised school outside NSW
- completed courses of study that satisfy the Board's curriculum and assessment requirements for the RoSA
- completed Year 10.

For Year 10 students leaving the school system this year, hard copies of the RoSA credentials will be sent to the student address

supplied by the school to arrive on or before Friday, 14 December, provided the Board is notified by 30 November.

Online results

Online records of courses studied and results will be made available for schools to see from 10 December.

Students will be able to access, print or download results on <u>Students Online</u> on the Board of Studies website, <u>http://studentsonline.bos.nsw.edu.au/</u>, from 12 December. Students can use their school-provided email address to activate their <u>Students Online</u> account.
