Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

As we are aware, the Commonwealth Government DER program that gave laptop computers to all year 9 students in NSW DEC schools has closed. The laptops

that were available to this year's year 9 group are on loan from the school and will be returned later this year or early next year. We have been discussing the next step in our use of digital technology and, like most schools, **will be moving in 2014 to a BYOD model.**

The BYOD model builds on the systems that have been developed in the school and will allow students to use a device of their own choice in class. The existing pool of laptops from the DER program will be available as backup or to assist students where families have difficulty managing the cost of a device. We expect that some students will prefer to use their own laptop or tablet rather than their DER laptop; we will be happy to move these laptops into the pool available to other students.

There is no preferred model or type of device under BYOD, but certain features will be required to make the device compatible with the school's wireless system. With Christmas coming up, many parents will be thinking of a device as a good present for their child. To make this easier, I have attached information from the DEC that gives you the requirements for a laptop or tablet that will be compatible with the school's system.

Further information will be available as the DEC develops its response to these changes, particularly around internet security and the sites that students can access while at school. There will be contracts developed, probably similar to the ones that we have used with the DER programs, ensuring that student and parents are aware of the responsible use of laptops and tablets in school. I have seen these in draft form and expect that they will be available to us next year.

Fortunately for us the position of Technical Support Officer (TSO) has been extended into next year and its further continuance is under discussion at government level. We have been very conscious of the excellent wok that Mr Smith has done with the DER laptops and generally with the school's IT program. He will continue to work with the many devices we have in the school – but will not be involved in the BYOD program. All devices brought to school under the BYOD program are the responsibility of the student: eg ensuring batteries are charged, assistance with software and hardware concerns.

BYOD Device Requirements Checklist

Wireless Connectivity

Wireless Connectivity is key to BYOD devices in schools! Devices must support 5Ghz dual band wireless or 802.11 a/b/g/n (Make sure it supports both 'a' and 'n')



Operating System

To ensure the latest programs and software are compatible, we recommend the current or previous version of any operating system. E.g. iOS 6 & 5 for iPads/iPods

Battery Life

Memory and RAM

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Minimum 5hrs

Devices need to last the school day, we recommend a minimum of 5hrs battery life

Hardware Features

Camera & Microphone

16 GB Storage 2 GB RAM

To be able to store and process data effectively these minimum specifications are recommended

Screen Size

Reasonable Size



These are necessary to ensure students can participate in 21st century learning activities, a stylus or keyboard may also be useful

Ensure the screen is of a reasonable size to enable ease of use throughout a school day

Other essential considerations

Casing: Needs to be tough and sturdy, can it be dropped without breaking?

Weight: Is the laptop light enough for your child to carry each day?

Durability: Consider the overall durability of the device, are the keys and inputs sturdy



Remember this device is expected to last several years



Accessories

Carry Case: A Carry case or skin is essential in protecting your device and can provide ergonomic advantages

Insurance: Devices can become lost or be broken easily at school, make sure your policy covers these eventualities

Warranty: Make sure you consider purchasing extra warranty to reduce future repair costs as these devices will be used extensively
