This is not a mandatory excursion, but it offers a great deal to the students - visits to the science museum/planetarium, the Victorian Parliament in the week leading up to their state election, Sovereign Hill gold-rush recreation and many other highlights.

I will emphasise that this is not a holiday for students - if it were, the school would not be doing it. The aim of the excursion is to provide life experiences that broaden the understanding of our students. At DHS we are very fortunate that our teachers do respond strongly to the needs of their students and allow long excursions like this one to happen.

TAX FILE NUMBERS

The Australian Taxation Office has decided not to continue The Secondary Schools Tax File Number (TFN) Program beyond 31 December 2014. This means that School TFN forms will no longer be processed beyond this date.

<u>How students can apply for a TFN from 1 January 2015</u> - The Australian Taxation Office in partnership with Australia Post is making it easier for individuals to apply for a TFN. Students can now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

Applying online is the fastest and most convenient way for students to get a TFN. More information on applying online can be found at ato.gov.au by searching for 'QC27248'

Students who are unable to visit a participating Australia Post office will need to complete the application form Tax file number - application or enquiry for individuals form (NAT 1432). More information about lodging this form can be found at ato.gov.au by searching for 'QC22604'
