Principal report Week 4 Term 4 2016 Welcome to our new Principal

Cyber-bullying

Last Friday we had the pleasure of having Jalem Gooch, a Police Liaison Officer, who came to talk to our students about cyber-bullying. She discussed; What is cyber-bullying, how police are working with schools and parents to prevent cyber-bullying and strategies to prevent cyber-bullying.

What is Cyber-bullying?

Cyber-bullying is an intentional, repeated behaviour by an individual or group to cause distress or undue pressure to others using technology. Today's technology allows children to communicate instantly with others in both positive and negative ways. Cyber-bullying includes all communications that seek to threaten, humiliate, intimidate, control or put another person or persons down.

How does Cyber-bullying work?

Cyber-bullying can be carried out through an internet service such as:

- Email
- Chat room
- Discussion group or forum
- Instant messaging apps

Cyber-bullying can also include bullying through mobile phones by:

- Text and picture messaging
- Video clips
- Facebook
- Phone calls

Online Safety Tips

Concerned about your child's safety online? Here are some guidelines that can help: Put the computer in a central area of the home, not in a bedroom

- Be reasonable and try to set reasonable expectations
- Be open with your child and encourage them to come to you if they encounter a problem online cultivate trust and communication because no rules, laws or filtering software can replace you as their first line of defence
- Talk with your child about how they use the Internet. Make sure they understand basic safety guidelines. These include protecting privacy (including passwords), never posting personal information, never meeting people they only know online and not posting inappropriate or potentially embarrassing photos
- Try to get your kids to share their blogs or online profiles with you, but be aware that they can have multiple accounts on multiple services
- If you are aware of school related bullying issues, please let the school know so we can support the situation

> Parent Portal (Sentral)

Sentral's parent portal provides parents with 24/7 access to important information about their child/children.

To use the Parent portal, you will need to register as a parent user. New parents have been sent a letter from the school by Mr Curran, our Sentral Coordinator, explaining this simple process and providing you with a unique access code. You cannot register without this code. If you do not receive a letter, or if you lose your registration access code, you can contact the school for a new one

You will be able to register for the Parent Portal at any time after receiving the letter.

➤ Student Letterbox

To save students lining up and waiting to hand in notes or pay for excursions, fees, etc we have started a new system with a 'Student Letterbox'. Students can drop the following in the Letterbox:

- · permission notes,
- absence notes,
- correct monies with permission note in a sealed envelope, and
- early leaver requests (note all Thursday early leaver requests must FIRST be signed by the Deputy).

If a student does need change and/or a receipt to take home they will need to stay in line, or come back later to collect it.

Japanese Calligraphy - shodo しょうど







Year 7 Japanese classes have been practicing their shodo skills this term. Shodo is a form of calligraphy, or artistic writing of the Japanese language.

In modern calligraphy, a number of tools are used to make a composition. These include a brush, ink stick, ink stone and special (expensive) mulberry paper called washi.

In the past, there has been a huge risk of accidents when using the black ink in class. Purchase of a new reusable magic cloth has solved this problem. When using the magic cloth, only a brush and water is now required.

When the water is applied to the cloth by brush, the painted area magically turns black. In time the water dries, the black marks disappear and the cloth is ready to be used again.

The calligraphy lessons have proven to be a most enjoyable activity and students have created some amazing Japanese writing.
