> Parent Portal (Sentral)

Sentral's parent portal provides parents with 24/7 access to important information about their child/children.

To use the Parent portal, you will need to register as a parent user. New parents have been sent a letter from the school by Mr Curran, our Sentral Coordinator, explaining this simple process and providing you with a unique access code. You cannot register without this code. If you do not receive a letter, or if you lose your registration access code, you can contact the school for a new one

You will be able to register for the Parent Portal at any time after receiving the letter.

> Student Letterbox

To save students lining up and waiting to hand in notes or pay for excursions, fees, etc we have started a new system with a 'Student Letterbox'. Students can drop the following in the Letterbox:

- · permission notes,
- · absence notes,
- correct monies with permission note in a sealed envelope, and
- early leaver requests (note all Thursday early leaver requests must FIRST be signed by the Deputy).

If a student does need change and/or a receipt to take home they will need to stay in line, or come back later to collect it.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

Helping a young person you are worried about!

When someone in your family has a mental health problem:

- **Keep communication open**, show empathy and don't rush into judgments
- Be available without being intrusive or 'pushy'
- Spend time with the person. Take an interest in their activities and encourage them to talk about what's happening in their life.
- · Take the person's feelings seriously
- Encourage and support positive friendships
- Encourage activities that promote mental health, such as exercise, healthy eating, regular sleep and doing things the person enjoys
- Give positive feedback
- Let the person know that you love them. They may not always admit it, but this is likely to be very important to them.

Parents and Carers also have the opportunity to attend safeTALK on Monday 15th August at 5.30pm. safeTALK is an alertness workshop that prepares anyone over the age of 18, regardless of prior experience or training, to become a suicide-alert helper. Most people with thoughts of suicide don't truly want to die, but are struggling with the pain in their lives. Through their words and actions, they invite help to stay alive. safeTALK-trained helpers can recognize these invitations and take action by connecting them with life-saving intervention resources, such as caregivers trained in ASIST.

At DHS we have several staff trained in ASIST. They are Mrs Neilson, Mr Kelly, Miss Redman, Ms Gavin, Mrs Kemp and Ms Dibley. We have a number of staff who have also completed the safeTALK training.



Support Unit – Hospitality task

The students in the support unit have been participating in a Hospitality class designed to provide these students with skills they can use when they leave school. The 5 senior students participated in an assessment task on Friday. They had to cook skewers and wedges and present them for marking.

Mustang is a 2015 internationally co-produced drama film directed by Turkish-French film director Deniz Gamze Ergüven. The film tells the story of five young orphaned sisters living in a remote Turkish village, who live under strict rules while members of their family prepare arranged marriages for them. The sisters share a common passion for freedom, and find ways of getting around the constraints imposed on them. Mustang was screened at the 2015 Cannes Film Festival, and won four Cesar awards, including Best First Feature Film, and Best Original Screenplay.
